



Receiving Instructions

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SIGNAL WORDS

This manual uses SIGNAL WORDS to direct the reader's attention to important safety-related messages. These messages describe uses of the product that could result in personal injury or property damage. Each signal word corresponds to a specific hazard level. The following are definitions of signal words that might appear in this manual.

A DANGER

Identifies a hazardous situation which, if not avoided, <u>WILL</u> result in DEATH or SERIOUS INJURY. Use of this signal word is limited to the most extreme situations.

AWARNING

Identifies a hazardous situation which, if not avoided, COULD result in DEATH or SERIOUS INJURY.

ACAUTION

Indicates a hazardous situation which, if not avoided, COULD result in MINOR or MODERATE injury.



Identifies practices likely to result in product/property damage, such as operation that might damage the product.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Vestil strives to identify all foreseeable hazards associated with the use of its products. However, material handling is dangerous and no manual can address every conceivable risk. Ultimately, the most effective way to prevent injury is to apply sound judgment whenever using this device.

AWARNING Improper or careless use of this product could result in death or serious personal injuries.


- Read and understand the entire manual before assembling, installing, using or servicing the product.
- Read the manual to refresh your understanding of proper use and maintenance procedures.
- DO NOT attempt to resolve any problem(s) with the product unless you are both authorized to do so and *certain* that it will be safe to use afterwards.
- DO NOT modify the product in any way UNLESS you first obtain written approval from Vestil. Unapproved modifications automatically void the Limited Warranty and might make the product unsafe to use.
- DO NOT exceed the capacity. See Label 287 in the *Labeling Diagram* on p. 4 and applied to product.
- Inspect the product before each use.
 - A. DO NOT use this product if the inspection reveals structural damage. Examples of structural damage include, but are not limited to, the following: 1) Cracked, broken or significantly deformed load-bearing members; 2) cracked welds; 3) corrosion, severe wear, or other condition that affects structural integrity of the product. Replace each part that fails to pass an inspection, and DO NOT use the product until it is <u>fully</u> restored to normal condition.
 - B. DO NOT use the product if any unusual noise or movement is observed. If a malfunction occurs, remove the unit from service and notify your supervisor & maintenance personnel about the issue.
- DO NOT use this device UNLESS all product labels are readable and undamaged. See *Labeling Diagram*.
- DO NOT sit, or ride, on the grader.
- DO NOT walk beneath the grader when it is elevated.
- DO NOT lift the grader over people.
- DO NOT lift people in the grader.
- DO NOT transport people with the grader.







USING THE GRADER ATTACHMENT

The grader attachment separates rocks of varying sizes by allowing small rocks and soil to fall through the openings in the bucket. Use the bucket to dig into soil containing rocks by angling the leading edge toward the ground. Drive forward carefully and lower the bucket to dig into the soil. Raise the leading edge (tip the bucket back) while elevating the bucket to sift material. Larger rocks will remain in the bucket while soil and small rocks fall through it.

RECORD OF SATISFACTORY CONDITION

Before using the product for the first time, make a written record of its appearance. Describe the condition of the frame, hardware, and quick-attachment sites. Take photographs of each feature. Take photographs of all labels applied to the product. Describe where each label is located. Add the photos to the record. *This record establishes satisfactory condition*.

INSPECTIONS AND MAINTENANCE


When conducting the following inspections, compare your observations to the *RECORD* to determine if a component is in satisfactory condition. Do not use the product unless every component is in satisfactory condition. Cosmetic changes, like damaged paint/powder coat do not constitute changes from satisfactory condition. However, touchup paint should be applied to all affected areas as soon as damage occurs. Contact Technical Service (contact information appears on the cover page) to order replacement parts.

Before each use — perform the following inspections.

- 1. Check the surface of the product for dirt or other matter. Clean the surfaces.
- 2. Examine hardware & fasteners, including but not limited to bolts, nuts, and pins. Replace damaged, worn, or corroded hardware.
- 3. Examine frame elements for excessive wear, breakages, corrosion/rusting, damage, and metal fatique.
- 4. Check all labels. Replace labels that are damaged or not easily readable. Refer to *LABELING DIAGRAM* below.
- 5. Examine the whole structure for severe rusting/metal erosion, rot, thinned regions. If rusting is purely superficial, remove the rust/corrosion with a steel bristle brush or steel wool. Clean the affected area and apply touchup paint. If rusting, rot, or thinning has weakened the material, contact technical service for advice.

LABELING DIAGRAM

The unit should be labeled as shown in the diagram. However, label content and locations are subject to change so your product might not be labeled exactly as shown. Replace all labels that are damaged, missing, or not easily readable (e.g. faded). LIMITED WARRANTY



Vestil Manufacturing Corporation ("Vestil") warrants this product to be free of defects in material and workmanship during the warranty period. Our warranty obligation is to provide a replacement for a defective, original part covered by the warranty after we receive a proper request from the Warrantee (you) for warranty service.

Who may request service?

Only a warrantee may request service. You are a warrantee if you purchased the product from Vestil or from an authorized distributor AND Vestil has been fully paid.

Definition of "original part"?

An original part is a part used to make the product as shipped to the Warrantee.

What is a "proper request"?

A request for warranty service is proper if Vestil receives: 1) a photocopy of the Customer Invoice that displays the shipping date; AND 2) a written request for warranty service including your name and phone number. Send requests by one of the following methods:

In the written request, list the parts believed to be defective and include the address where replacements should be delivered. After Vestil receives your request for warranty service, an authorized representative will contact you to determine whether your claim is covered by the warranty. Before providing warranty service, Vestil will require you to send the entire product, or just the defective part (or parts), to its facility in Angola, IN.

What is covered under the warranty?

The warranty covers defects in the following original, dynamic parts: motors, hydraulic pumps, motor controllers, and cylinders. It also covers defects in original parts that wear under normal usage conditions ("wearing parts"), such as bearings, hoses, wheels, seals, brushes, and batteries.

How long is the warranty period?

The warranty period for original dynamic components is 90 days. For wearing parts, the warranty period is 90 days. Both warranty periods begin on the date Vestil ships the product to the Warrantee. If the product was purchased from an authorized distributor, the periods begin when the distributor ships the product. Vestil may, at its sole discretion, extend a warranty period for products shipped from authorized distributors by up to 30 days to account for shipping time.

If a defective part is covered by the warranty, what will Vestil do to correct the problem?

Vestil will provide an appropriate replacement for any covered part. An authorized representative of Vestil will contact you to discuss your claim.

What is not covered by the warranty?

The Warrantee (you) are responsible for paying labor costs and freight costs to return the product to Vestil for warranty service.

Events that automatically void this Limited Warranty.

- Misuse:
- Negligent assembly, installation, operation or repair;
- Installation/use in corrosive environments:
- Inadequate or improper maintenance;
- Damage sustained during shipping;
- Collisions or other accidents that damage the product;
- Unauthorized modifications: Do not modify the product IN ANY WAY without first receiving written authorization from Vestil.

Do any other warranties apply to the product?

Vestil Manufacturing Corp. makes no other express warranties. All implied warranties are disclaimed to the extent allowed by law. Any implied warranty not disclaimed is limited in scope to the terms of this Limited Warranty. Vestil makes no warranty or representation that this product complies with any state or local design. performance, or safety code or standard. Noncompliance with any such code or standard is not a defect in material or workmanship.
